

ADVICE TO STUDENTS AND PARENTS

ON DRESS CODE

Please ensure all items of clothing, shoes and personal items are clearly marked with your child's name, preferably with permanent marker.

MODIFICATIONS TO THE DRESS CODE

Students who for religious or health reasons, may wish to modify the school dress code are required to make an appointment with the principal to discuss such modifications. Staff will be informed of any student granted a modification to the dress code.

NON COMPLIANCE

The following will occur for students not following the dress code:

- Encouragement to wear the uniform
- Assistance/support in obtaining suitable clothing, if necessary.
- Parents may be contacted.
- The school may provide substitute clothing for the day.

Students not following the dress code without written explanation by their Parent or Guardian, may be denied the opportunity to represent the school at official school activities which include excursions, sporting and social events.

FINANCIAL DIFFICULTIES

Students whose families experience financial difficulties regarding the purchase of a uniform should contact the Principal to discuss the situation.

DRESS CODE FOR STUDENTS

HEALTH AND SAFETY

1. Students should ensure that they take appropriate protection from the sun when outdoors. They are encouraged to wear hats all year round (Broad brimmed or legionnaires). Visors, beanies and baseball hats do not provide appropriate cover and are not to be worn in place of a hat.



NO HAT= NO PLAY is our policy.

1. Students who do not wear a hat will be restricted to the covered assembly area during recess and lunch breaks. During sports sessions students without hats will be given a blue hat to wear.
2. Appropriate footwear is to be worn. No thongs or scuffs, health or beach sandals are permitted.
3. Jewellery – for safety reasons children may only wear small sleepers or studs in ears and a watch.
4. The Education Department Regulations state that hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back with a plain scrunchie or hair elastic.
5. Care must be taken when using Umbrellas.

INAPPROPRIATE DRESS

- Denim is NOT permitted.
- All cosmetics are inappropriate at school.
- Brand name clothing is NOT acceptable.
