


Restorative Practices

Restorative practice seeks to repair relationships that have been damaged through hurtful behaviours. It does this by by bringing about a sense of remorse and restorative action by the offender and forgiveness by the victim. When offenders reflect upon their harm to victims:

- they become remorseful and act restoratively.
- resolution focuses on the unacceptable behaviour rather than the moral character of the offender.
- this can lead to effective learning on healthy interpersonal relations among members of the school community.



- Effectively use student achievement and progress data to drive decision making The Business Plan is a dynamic document that we will use to continuously measure our progress against our key focus areas.



Cycle of Improvement


East Beechboro Primary School follows a robust cycle of annual self assessment based on the collaborative analysis of whole school and national data related to our strategic improvement targets. We ensure continuity of practice is reflected through the Business Plan, into the Operational Plans, which then translates into classroom planning to improve student outcomes.







2025 - 2027 Targets



East Beechboro Primary School maintains a culture of continuous growth.

To embed change, Literacy, Numeracy, and Wellbeing targets have been identified. Operational Plans will include yearly goals and strategies to meet these targets. Progress will be reviewed yearly.

Target Literacy

NAPLAN

- Student achievement will continue to exceed like schools in all assessment areas.
- In Year 3 Reading the number of students with low or very low progress will be reduced.
- In Year 5 the number of students in the 'Needs additional support' category for Reading and Writing will be reduced.

PAT Assessment

- To make year on year progress in PAT Reading global target across the school.
- To increase the percentage of students in PAT Reading in band 70 and above in Years 2 and 3.
- To increase the percentage of students in PAT Reading in band 110 and above in Years 4, 5 and 6.

Target Maths

NAPLAN

- Student achievement will continue to exceed like schools in Maths.
- In Year 3 Maths, the number of students with low or very low progress will be reduced.
- In Year 5 the number of students in the 'Needs additional support' category for Maths will be reduced.

PAT Assessment


- All cohorts will close the gap between East Beechboro PS performance and the Australian mean for Maths
- Achieve twelve months or more growth in all PAT Maths assessments with whole school improvement in problem solving.

Target Health & Wellbeing

Rumbles Quest Assessment

- Reduce the percentage of students with a low attachment to school from 17.6% to less than 15% (approx 10 students).
- Improve the social confidence of Year 4, 5 and 6 students.

- Staff using collaborative DOTT to analyse assessment data, moderate and collaboratively plan quality, differentiated teaching and learning programs

Build staff capacity to ensure consistency in the delivery of whole school practices to improve student outcomes.




What you will see




Ensure data collection and analysis practices lead to improved student outcomes
