From the Principal

Dear Families and Staff,

Our annual ANZAC Service, held on Wednesday in Week 1, was once again a moving and memorable event for our school community. We are deeply grateful to our past student and ex-serviceman, Mr Ned Robinson, who attended in full-service uniform and spoke to our students about living the values of the ANZAC spirit—courage, mateship, resilience, and selflessness. His message encouraged us all to reflect on how these values can be demonstrated in our everyday lives.

We also extend our sincere thanks to ex-student and bugler Jarad Penfold, whose performances of the Last Post and Reveille were, as always, flawless. His playing added a genuine sense of authenticity and solemnity to the service. We were also grateful to welcome our other special guests, Mr Duncan Fairbairn, ex-serviceman, Councillor Dean and Councillor Kaur from the City of Swan, EBPS Board Chair Mrs Karen Lippinkhoff and P&C President Ms Emillie O'Keefe. Our school choir performed beautifully under the guidance of Ms Veitch, and I commend them for a wonderful performance. It was a privilege to also host many school families as visitors to the service. I would also like to acknowledge our Year 6 students for their polished and confident leadership throughout the ceremony, and to all students for their respectful attendance.

In Science over the past few weeks, students have been actively engaged in learning about STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) concepts through a range of hands-on challenges. Classes have been designing and building towers and bridges using materials such as skewers and marshmallows, blocks, cards, cups, pop sticks and dominoes. Through these engaging tasks, students have been investigating which shapes and structures provide the greatest strength and stability and applying this knowledge to improve and refine their designs. It has been wonderful to see their creativity, collaboration and problem-solving skills in action.

Looking ahead, Friday June 5 will be our Reporting to Parents Interview Day. This is a pupil-free day, introduced by the Department of Education to support recent changes to end-of-semester reporting. Families who require care for their children on this day are able to book through Camp Australia, with bookings already open. The link to the sign-up schedule for booking appointments with staff will be sent out via Compass in the next few weeks.

From 2026, end-of-semester reports will no longer include individual comments for each learning area, there will be a single overall comment. For this semester only, due to the retirement of Pak G from his permanent position at EBPS, student reports will not include a Languages grade. We are actively working to appoint a new Languages teacher and aim to have this in place for Semester 2.

A gentle reminder to families that dogs are not permitted on school grounds. Unfortunately, we recently had an incident where a student stepped in dog waste while playing on the oval. Maintaining a clean and safe environment for all students is a shared responsibility, and we appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

Finally, I would like to emphasise the importance of regular school attendance for all of our students. Consistent attendance is critical to student learning and wellbeing. The Department of Education highlights that students who attend school regularly are more likely to achieve better academic outcomes, build strong social connections, and develop positive learning habits. Even missing one day per fortnight can equate to four weeks of lost

learning over the course of a year. Establishing strong attendance patterns from an early age sets students up for long-term success, both academically and socially.

Thank you, as always, for your ongoing support of our school.

CYBER SAFETY APP FOR PARENTS

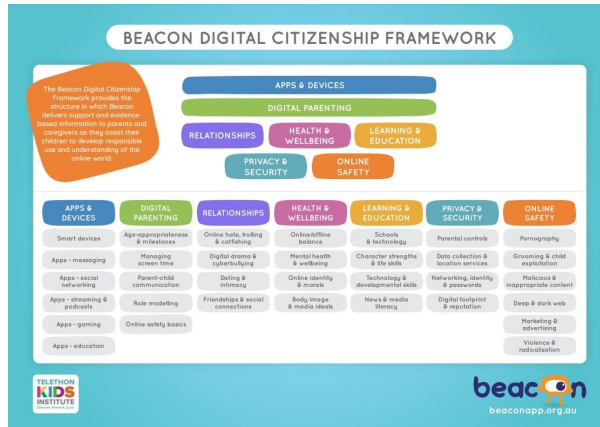

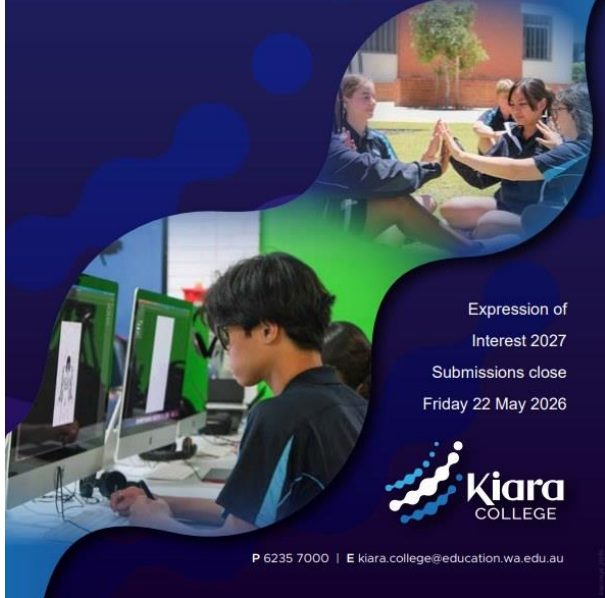

About the program

Kiara College's Specialised Learning Program (SLP) for students with autism offers personalised support aimed at enhancing learning engagement, academic achievement, and the development of adaptive skills.

The program is designed for autistic students in Years 7 - 12 who may be at risk of disengagement and underachievement, or facing challenges in learning and developing essential life skills.

The SLP focuses on overcoming barriers to learning and encourages participation in mainstream classrooms alongside their peers. Through tailoring individualised programs, the SLP aims to unlock each student's potential by nurturing organisational skills, enhancing social cognition, fostering positive peer relationships, and promoting emotional self-regulation. Ultimately, the program aims to facilitate students' academic success and overall learning capabilities.

The SLP does not operate as a unit or a separate school. Students are integrated into mainstream classes at Kiara College, continuing to attend alongside their peers while receiving the targeted support that they need through the SLP.

Within a model of support that embraces neurodiversity

Eligibility

Students eligible for this program have a diagnosis, however may face barriers which impede their full access to the wider curriculum and put them at risk of underachievement or disengagement.

Please note that meeting eligibility criteria does not guarantee placement, as applications exceed available spots. Our assessment process is comprehensive, aimed at understanding each student's needs and determining how the SLP can support them in thriving throughout their educational journey. Current supporting information or updated medical reports will be requested to assist in this assessment.

Students eligible for enrolment in the SLP: Autism will meet the following eligibility criteria:

affirming practices and responsive, evidence-based educational programming, the SLP aims to enrich the educational experience for autistic students. This initiative focuses on:

- Enhancing attendance and retention rates
- Improving curriculum access and engagement
- Promoting positive academic and non-academic outcomes
- Implementing early identification and targeted interventions to address academic and non-academic barriers, while recognising the unique learning needs of autistic students and tailoring instruction accordingly

Specialised Learning Programs facilitate collaborative approaches between schools and communities, encouraging a shared investment in outcomes for autistic students. They work to expand enrolment opportunities for autistic students and enhance whole-school knowledge regarding positive supports and evidence based practices. Specialised Learning Programs foster school-community partnerships and strengthen relationships between students, their families or caregivers, and the school. At Kiara College, the SLP will align with the school's vision of empowering all students to develop the skills and abilities necessary to become responsible, informed, and active citizens who contribute positively to society.

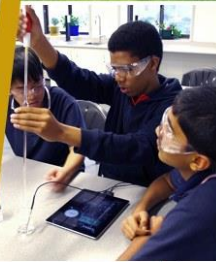
